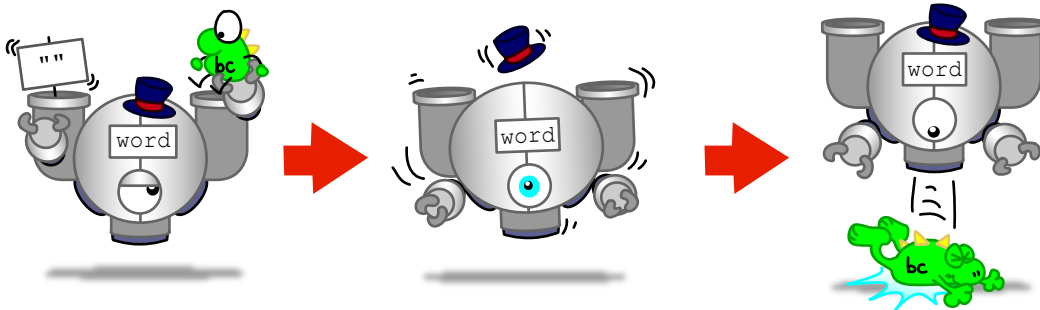


This is an empty word.

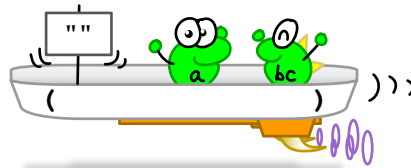
It must be given double quotes, to make it "visible".



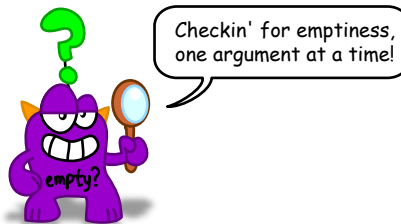
However, empty words "disappear" when you call `word` on them with some non-empty words, because `word` simply ignores them.



`sentence`, on the other hand, does not ignore empty words.



How can you tell when a word or sentence is empty? Simply call the predicate `empty?`!



How does `empty?` work? It returns true if the input is a word with no characters or a sentence with no words and false otherwise.
